

#### 1 The white earthen walls on the grounds of Enzoji Temple

#### 2 Tsumujikura Fall

A waterfall at the foot of Mt. Hakase, the tallest in Yanaizu. (Height: upper level 25m, lower level 60m) Access: 30 minutes by car from Aizu-Bange IC)

#### 3 The grounds of Enzoji Temple

In autumn, the entire area of Enzoji Temple is painted red with autumn foliage. Access: 7 min on foot from Aizu-Yanaizu Station on the JR Tadami Line









#### 1 Okunoin Bentendo

A thatched-roof temple erected roughly 600 years ago that has been designated an Important Cultural Asset.

Located at the confluence of the Tadami and Ginzan Rivers, this land has long been afflicted by floods, so Benzaiten was enshrined here to ward off flooding.

#### 2 Chigo Parade

Held on the 10th of August every year to remember the ancestors.

Children holding lanterns and wearing

period costumes parade along the Tadami riverside to Uobuchi.

The lanterns floating down the river afterward at dusk is magical.

# 3 Nanoka-do Hadaka Mairi (Naked Man Festival)

An odd festival passed down in Yanaizu for thousands of years. On the night of January 7th every year, at the ringing of a bell on the temple grounds, men climb to the gong in Kiko Hall, and it is said that the fierce battle that ensues brings a year of health, wealth, and fulfillment of prayers. This started with a legend in which the power of the people drove out the dragon god living in Tadami River.








#### Yanaizu Akabeko Family

The Yanaizu Akabeko Family has four members, father Fukutaro, mother Mitsuko, son Mo-kun, and daughter Ai-chan. Find all members of the family while walking around town.



A great earthquake that hit the Aizu area in 1611 leveled the main hall of Enzoji Temple and houses in Yanaizu as well, creating massive damage. In 1617, a new hall was rebuilt on the present rock. The timber used at the time was donated by villages upstream of the Tadami River and was transported to Yanaizu by the river, but the people were at a loss as to how to get the timber from the river onto the big rock. Just then, a herd of red cattle appeared out of nowhere to help carry the timber. Thanks to them the main hall was completed, and this is where the story of Akabeko originates. Folk crafts featuring Akabeko are widely popular as talismans to ward off disaster and to pray to the gods.



# Fukuman Kokuzo Bosatsu Enzoji Temple

One of three Kokuzo Bosatsus (Akasagarbha Bodhisattva) in Japan, with 1200 years of history

Fukuman Kokuzo Bosatsu Enzoji Temple, a famous temple in the Aizu region, has attracted even greater faith than in the past. Along with the ones at Daimanji Temple in the village of Tokai, Ibaraki Prefecture and at Nomanji Temple in the town of Amatsukominato, Chiba Prefecture, this is counted as one of the three Kokuzo Bosatsu in Japan. According to legend, Kobo Daishi received a sacred tree from a Tang high priest, and after returning to Japan, he split the tree into three pieces and threw it in the ocean, where they floated to Ibaraki, Chiba, and Yanaizu. Hearing this story, Kobo Daishi carved the Kokuzo Bosatsu into that tree. Later, when Enzoji Temple was founded by Tokuitsu Daishi in the year 807, he enshrined that carving of the Kokuzo Bosatsu said to be the work of Kobo Daishi.



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<sup>\*</sup>Enzoji Temple and its grounds are not a sightseeing spot, but rather a place of religious worship, so please be quiet. Also, photography within the temples is prohibited.

#### Miniature Wood Carvings (Fuzan Kobo)

The world-class craftsmanship of Yanaizu. Little gods sit enshrined within walnut or sesame wood.



#### Awa Manju, a specialty of Yanaizu

About 190 years ago, after a string of fires and disasters, a craftsman living at Enzoji Temple had a baker dedicate this pastry at the gate of the temple to pray that disaster would not strike again.

\*There are shops selling limited-edition cherry blossom flavored awa manju from March to April.





#### Kobo Oshimizu

Legend has it that long ago, Kobo Daishi, who carved the bodhisattva statue, broke open a hole in a rock with his walking stick to bring forth spring water as his way of thanking the local people, who worshiped him and treated him with hospitality. This water, beloved by the townspeople, continues to spring forth to this day.




